There is the 'adoption' of Heathcliff by Earnshaw's and the adoption of Hareton by Heathcliff. The other greatness is the great example of Gothic elements such as weather, dark atmosphere, supernatural allusions and melodrama. The dark and stormy night motif is still popular and still effective today and fans of twilight owe.

To put it more effect on the title is, it is Love and revenge are the two main themes in the novel as they are two key themes, that result in its plot and the way in which Heathcliff

sets out to seemingly take over and destroy the Einton family. He takes revenge on Hindley for the way in which he treated him when he was master of wuthering Heights and also the way in which he gains revenge on Edgar through the way in which marries his sister and then forces his beloved daughter into marriage with his son and tries to keep her from being with him when she dies. Revenge is not shown to be exclusive property of Heathcliff alone, Catherine too consumed with revenge by staying away from the two men. was the middle daughter of a family that lived in northern England in the mid nineteenth century., The cause for theme of revenge is the love that Heathcliff and Catherine have each other. Catherine famous description of love for Heathcliff is beautifully expressed in chapter IX. Her declaration of love is one of the classical element that carried the novel to the extent of the superlative degree of “The Best”

“My love for Linton is like the foliage in the woods: time will change it, I’m well aware, as winter changes the trees. My love for Heathcliff resembles the eternal rocks beneath: a source of little visible delight, but necessary. Nelly, I am Heathcliff! He’s always, always in my mind: not as a pleasure, any more than I am always a pleasure to myself, but as my own being.”pg82.

The heroine took Edgar necessary for life and Heathcliff as her lover, essential for her soul. It has been voted the first greatest love story. The passionate romance that proved ardor can survive Britain’s grimmest landscape and weather has beaten countless steamy successors of the greatest love stories of all time. Emily Bronte’s wuthering Heights, recovering the doomed affair between sweet Catherine Earnshaw and the brutal outsider Heathcliff has seen. “ It’s really heartening to see how these stories written so long ago, retain the power to captivate 21st century audiences” said Richard Kingsbury channel head of UKTV drama, Brooding was valued and arrogance also had its place, accounting in part for Heathcliff’s appeal. Wuthering Heights revolves around the passionate and destructive love between its

central character. Catherine Earnshaw beautiful and strong and her tall, handsome, dark and brooding hero/devil, Heathcliff. In fact, this novel is all about things being both very black and very white characters are both very good and very bad. Love is both true and a total lie. A Wuthering height is undoubtedly a work of many singular merits. It is not a novel which deals with shows of society, the surfaces and cognatic of life. It lifts the veil and shows the dark side of our depraved nature charlotte Bronte sister gave her impressions as follows:

Generally, the characters in the novel would be realistic but here it is a class in itself by showing her characters differ from real men and women Emily's seeing could not be presented through normal men and women. There are appropriate for the world to which they belong but they misfit in the real, factual world. The novel shows a masterly narrative in the events of same forty years rapidly pass before our eyes. The story comes to us through narrators, they faithfully report what they have seen and heard and interpret it by their own standards.

Supernatural events happen in the very beginning of the novel and continue until the very end. In chapter three Lockwood is grabbed and pleaded to by Catherine's ghost through a window, and in the last chapter Ellen talks about people seeing the ghosts of Heathcliff and Catherine walking on the moors. In between Heathcliff tells Ellen about hearing Catherine sighing in the graveyard and sensing her nearby, and when he gives up his plans of revenge he even seems to see her ghost. Ellen also once sees Heathcliff as a goblin, and wonders if he is a vampire or a spirit although she realizes she is being silly. It is a revengeful When Catherine betrays Heathcliff by marrying Edgar Linton, Heathcliff feels she has betrayed the freedom they shared as children on the moor. He exacts a terrible revenge. However, he is no mere Gothic villain. Somehow, the reader sympathizes with this powerful figure who is possessed by his beloved.

Many of the characters seem to enjoy solitude. Heathcliff and Hindley both state their preference for isolation early in the novel, and Lockwood explains that solitude is one of the reasons he chose to move to the remote Thrushcross Grange. Each of these characters believes that solitude will help them get over romantic disappointments: Heathcliff becomes

increasingly withdrawn after Catherine's death; Hindley becomes crueler than ever to others after he loses his wife, Frances; and Lockwood's move to the Grange was precipitated by a briefly mentioned romantic disappointment of his own. However, Brontë ultimately casts doubt on solitude's ability to heal psychic wounds. Heathcliff's yearning for Catherine causes him to behave like a monster to people around him; Hindley dies alone as an impoverished alcoholic.

Just to sum up that reading classic or A fiction allows to leave the ego at the door and see just how many modern ideas are there when we try to evaluate literature it should come it a notion that there is reservoir of ideas from which writers draw their inspiration. It is always noted that the most enjoyable aspects of reading classic literature is watching the most talented artists engage in important role in the whole story, an exchange of idea impact the Gothic influence and its flow of events and several character. The prominent writer of this type of genre was Jane Austen, she exhibited fantastic representation of terror. It has heightened the passion of human story without the effect of absurdity. Thus, this novel of nineteenth century made an outset of the detailed description of the romantic elements. It made the novel more classical than the other novel of her time.
