Abstract

The abstract should summarize the content of the paper. Try to keep the abstract below 200 words. Do not make references nor display equations in the abstract. The journal will be printed from the same-sized copy prepared by you. Your manuscript should be printed on A4 paper (21.0 cm x 29.7 cm). It is imperative that the margins and style described below be adhered to carefully. This will enable us to keep uniformity in the final printed copies of the Journal. Please keep in mind that the manuscript you prepare will be photographed and printed as it is received. Readability of copy is of paramount importance.

Keywords - About 5 Keywords (Capitalize Only First Letter of Each Word), separated by comma

Introduction

(Indent the first line of paragraphs 0.5 inch from the left margin. Press only Tab key)

The introduction of the paper should explain the nature of the problem, previous work, purpose, and the contribution of the paper. The contents of each section may be provided to understand easily about the paper.

Heading

The headings and subheadings, starting with "1. Introduction", appear in upper and lower case letters and should be set in Normal and aligned flush left. All headings from the Introduction to Acknowledgements are numbered sequentially using 1, 2, 3, etc. Subheadings are numbered 1.1, 1.2, etc. If a subsection must be further divided, the numbers 1.1.1, 1.1.2, etc.

The font size for **heading is 12 points Normal face** and **subsections with 12 points and not Normal. Do not underline any of the headings, or add dashes, colons, etc.**

If you are using a quotation longer than four lines of prose or three lines of verse, indent the entire quote 1-inch from the left margin. Omit quotation marks and use a colon before beginning the block quote. Dr. Tiwari stated that:

Figures and Tables

To ensure a high-quality product, diagrams and lettering **MUST** be either computer-drafted or drawn using India ink.

Figure captions appear below the figure, are flush left, and are in lower case letters. When referring to a figure in the body of the text, the abbreviation "Fig." is used. Figures should be numbered in the order they appear in the text.

Table captions appear centered above the table in upper and lower case letters. When referring to a table in the text, no abbreviation is used and "Table" is capitalized.

Conclusion

A conclusion section must be included and should indicate clearly the advantages, limitations, and possible applications of the paper. Although a conclusion may review the main points of the paper, do not replicate the abstract as the conclusion. A conclusion might elaborate on the importance of the work or suggest applications and extensions.

Acknowledgements (if any)

An acknowledgement section may be presented after the conclusion, if desired.

Works Cited (12 Normal)

Work Cited always starts from the new page. If work cited line automatically goes to second line then Don't press Enter and Tab to indent the line. Just Drag the pointer from the ruler bar to 0.5-Inch
